We're the state's largest college district with nearly 50,000 students every year, and we have educated and trained more than 2 million students since 1966.

More of our students transfer and get skilled jobs

We send more transfer students and more students of color than any other community college to the UW where they do as well or better in both GPA and graduation rates than those who start as freshmen at UW

80% of workforce training students found jobs within 9 months, even in a down economy

Diversity flourishes

Half of our students are students of color, representing more than 80 first languages

Our workforce is the most diverse among community colleges across the state

Pathways to Careers leads to middle-wage jobs for the region in collaboration with Seattle businesses, education, government and non-profits

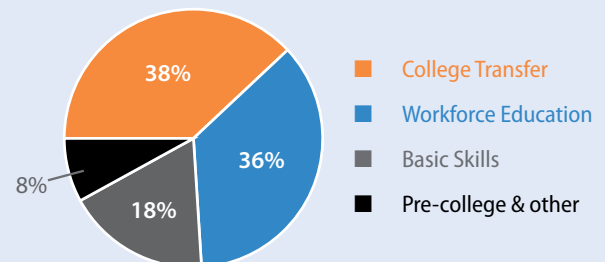
