Policy on Drugs

As part of providing a healthful, safe and secure work and learning environment, employees and students of Seattle Community College District VI are expected to be in the appropriate condition to perform assigned duties and to fully participate in the learning process.

District Policy 249 states that, "It is the policy of Seattle Community College District to prohibit the unlawful manufacturing, distributing, possessing, or use of illicit drugs and abuse of alcohol. This policy applies to all employees and students of Seattle Community College District VI, while in or on any owned and/or controlled property of Seattle Community College District VI, or while conducting college business regardless of location.

"Violation of this policy by an employee will result in discipline up to and including termination of employment, depending upon the seriousness of the violation... Students who violate this policy will be disciplined up to and including expulsion from the District, depending upon the seriousness of the violation... Students may also lose federal funding and/or grants for their education."
